




When I hear His tender invitation and see His wondrous grace,

By Thy Spirit enliven my faith rightly to discern and spiritually to apprehend the Saviour.

While I gaze upon the emblems of my Saviour's death, may I ponder why He died, and hear Him say, 'I gave my life to purchase yours, presented Myself an offering to expiate your sin, shed My blood to blot out your guilt, opened My side to make you clean, endured your curses to set you free, bore your condemnation to satisfy divine justice.'

O may I rightly grasp the breadth and length of this design, draw near, obey, extend the hand, take the bread, receive the cup, eat and drink, testify before all men that I do for myself, gladly, in faith, reverence and love, receive my Lord, to be my life, strength, nourishment, joy, delight.

In the supper I remember His eternal love, boundless grace, infinite compassion, agony, cross, redemption, and receive assurance of pardon, adoption, life, glory.



#### PARTICIPATING IN THE LORD'S SUPPER

#### 1 CORINTHIANS 11:23-34

The Lord Supper: also commonly called "communion," is a sacrament where Christ is spiritually present, offering us His body and blood to nourish our faith. As we eat, we participate in His death and resurrection and the sacrament acts as a means of grace to build us up in faith.

We welcome all who have professed faith in Jesus Christ, been baptized, have been admitted to the table, and are genuinely seeking to live a godly life. If that doesn't describe you, we ask that you not participate. However, please come and speak to a pastor or an elder if you desire to be baptized or participate in the future.

If you do not participate, you can use the prayers below during this time of quiet receiving. If you do receive the sacraments, you can meditate on the love of Jesus Christ for you. Consider the prayer on the other side of this sheet to help you think of His grace.

Today, we will distribute the bread and the cup separately to you in your seats. We will eat the bread together and then we will drink the cup together. The bread is gluten free. The cup has grape juice.

#### **Prayer for Those Searching for Truth**

Lord Jesus, You claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following You as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what You claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who You are. Give me an understanding of You that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life that You promise. Amen.

#### **Prayer of Belief**

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but through You I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank You for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. Knowing that You have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive You as Savior and Lord. Amen.

#### **Prayer for Those Struggling with Sin**

Lord Jesus, grant that I may see in You the fulfillment of all my need, and may turn from every false satisfaction to feed on You, the true and living bread. Enable me to lay aside the sin that clings so closely, and run with perseverance the race set before me, looking to You, the pioneer and perfecter of my faith. Amen.

#### **Prayer of Commitment**

Lord Jesus, You have called us to follow You in baptism and a life of committed discipleship in Your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with Your people, and live in the fullness of Your Spirit. Amen.

#### For Reflection and Discussion

Week of October 6, 2024

"Politics and Providence (Part 4): The King God Chose"
Acts 13:21-22

- 1. Read Acts 13:21-22
- 2. What does it mean to be "a man after God's own heart" (Acts 13:22), in light of the context that God first made this statement (see Acts 13:21 and 1 Samuel 13:8-14, especially verse 14). What was God looking for in contrast to what He already had in King Saul?
  - 3. How did Saul show he was not a man after God's heart?

Consider also these verses:

Rash vows: 1 Samuel 14:24-30; 1 Samuel 14:43-45

Murderous jealousy: 1 Samuel 18:8-11; 1 Samuel 19:1

Witchcraft: 1 Samuel 28:7-8

Ignoring prophets: 1 Samuel 15:22-23

Killing of priests: 1 Samuel 22:16-19

Seeing these actions, what does this show us about Saul's heart? What motivated him? What place did the Lord have?

- 4. In what ways did David's heart and actions differ from Saul's? Consider 1 Samuel 17:45-47; Psalm 51:1-2; 1 Samuel 24:6; 2 Samuel 7:12-13; 2 Samuel 24:24.
- 5. What are some of the qualities of leadership that we tend to value in our culture today? How do they compare to God's standards for leadership?

- 6. How do you reconcile David's significant sins with the fact that God still called him a man after His own heart? Why do you think David was the standard for faithfulness with future kings? (1 Kings 9:4-5; 2 Kings 2:22)
- 7. One part of David's life was his humility and repentance (Psalm 32:1-5; Psalm 51:1-19). Why is this important to God's vision for leadership?

What motivated David to repent and how should that inspire us to the same humility?

- 8. Discuss the idea of God using flawed leaders like David to accomplish His purposes, and to approve their leadership, even with those flaws. How does this shape your understanding of leadership in the church and in the world?
- 9. Consider Philippians 2:5-11. How does Jesus Christ fulfill the role of the ultimate king that David pointed to? How should this shape our expectations for leadership in the church and in politics?
- 10. As Christians, how do we navigate our responsibility in voting for leaders when none of the options seem to fully reflect godly principles? How can we apply biblical wisdom in these decisions?
- 11. How can you apply this passage to your life this week?
